The Sahel Symposium is bilingual with presentations in English and French

Global geopolitical transformations are undermining the democratic foundations of our societies as well as fundamental human rights such as freedom of speech and freedom of association. These restrictions on freedom also affect academia. The risk is to marginalize the production of knowledge, to silence it and affect the production of knowledge for decades to come.

In the Sahel region, despite the fact that important research is produced by academics based in universities and research institutes, the transformations are characterized by ruptures that threaten the continuity of empirical research, education of students, the circulation of knowledge and the collaboration between researchers located in the Sahel, and other parts of the world. At a time when the global order is undergoing fundamental shifts, when sovereigntist movements manifest a clear momentum for decolonial reflections, time is ripe to reimagine academic collaborations and spaces between researchers across the Sahel and Europe.

The 2026 Sahel Symposium at Uppsala University will focus on how to rethink and reinvigorate Academic Collaborations and Spaces in the Sahel. This fourth edition aims to provide early-career researcher with a safe space where they can present the findings of their research and discuss them with colleagues from various disciplines and/or fieldwork research area. The Sahel Symposium will also host the hybrid launching the new AEGIS Collaborative Research Group *Le monde du Sahel: Promoting Academic Collaborations and Spaces (Sahel/PAX)*. The [CRG Sahel/PAX](#) aims to cultivate an intellectual space for research and research collaborations in the Sahel, and a pole of exchange for knowledge produced from the Sahel, nourished by the decolonial ambition to centre the gaze in the Sahel, towards the world. The symposium will also explore opportunities for bridging basic research and more applied forms of work by collaborating with actors outside of universities and research institutes.
